

(3) Cognitive Assessment (IQ)

Cognitive assessments or intelligence tests are used to determine a child's learning capability by identifying their cognitive strengths and weaknesses. When interpreted in combination with comprehensive background information, parent and teacher interviews, the results of cognitive tests can provide a profile which can assist with the development of individualised intervention and learning plans for children.

At Prosper Health Collective a full cognitive assessment for a child or adolescent involves the following:

1. Parent Initial Consultation – 50 minutes
2. Cognitive (IQ) Assessment – 90 minutes
3. Liaison with teachers and other health professionals as required
4. Report Preparation – 60 minutes
5. Parent Feedback Consultation – 30 minutes

Please note:

- Medicare or private health insurance funds typically do not offer a rebate for psychological assessments.
- In situations where previous psychometric testing has been completed, it may not be appropriate to undertake all the above steps and the price will be adjusted accordingly.
- In some situations, further assessment may be required and this will incur additional costs. This will be done in consultation with you.
