

(4) ADHD Assessments

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is a neurodevelopmental disorder with an onset typically before 12 years of age. Features include difficulties with attention and/or hyperactivity and impulsivity which are incongruent with a person's age and interfere with activities and participation.

An assessment for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity disorder involves an assessment of a child's behavioural and cognitive functioning.

At Prosper Health Collective a full ADHD assessment for a child or adolescent involves the following:

1. Parent/Child Initial Consultation – up to 90 minutes
2. Child Assessment including clinical interview and cognitive (IQ) Assessment – 120 minutes
3. Liaison with teachers and other health professionals as required
4. Report Preparation – 120 minutes
5. Parent Feedback Consultation – 30 minutes

Please note:

- A thorough assessment by an appropriately trained and credentialed clinician is needed to make a diagnosis of ADHD.
- A Paediatrician, Psychiatrist, or Neurologist may be required as part of the diagnostic process.
- Medicare or private health insurance funds typically do not offer a rebate for psychological Assessments.
- In situations where previous psychometric testing has been completed, it may not be appropriate to undertake all of the above steps and the price will be adjusted accordingly.
- In some situations further assessment may be required and this will incur additional costs. This will be done in consultation with you.
